Summary: 2018 Salzburg International Summer Academy of Fine Arts

2018 course programme

"Transgressing boundaries" – the motto of the 2018 courses and events – covered a wide field of explicitly political and artistic questions. Ahlam Sibli, for instance, dealt in her course with the notion of HOME, and Emeka Okereke focused on photography as a tool in the post-colonial age. Ei Arakawa's class, by contrast, "let paintings sing", and staged a spectacular, diversified performance by teachers and students at the second opening of the *20 Propositions* exhibition in the Salzburg Kunstverein. Tony Chakar and his students presented their exploration of the town of Salzburg in a performative town walk.

Currently in Hohensalzburg Fortress: Aisha Khalid (miniature painting), **Till Megerle** (drawing), **Yorgos Sapountzis** (performance, installation), **Ekaterina Shapiro-Obermair** (print-making), **Sabine B. Vogel** (blogging) and **Mark Van Yetter** (painting)

Yorgos Sapountzis' class will give a nightfall performance, to accompany visitors out of the Fortress at the end of the final day (Friday 24 August at 8 pm).

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2018 Programme of Events

The conference *Global Academy II, examples of transcultural exchange* brought together 29 speakers from all over the world for an intensive exchange of ideas, thus focusing on the long-term *Global Academy* project.

The six weeks of the Summer Academy saw numerous **Artists' Talks** in the Galerie 5020 with the teachers, who offered insights into their creative work.

Three **Town Walks**, billed as *The outskirts of a town – Encounters on the periphery*, explored various marginal areas of Salzburg. From the graffiti scene, through the interface between science and art, to alternative perceptions of the town and bloggers' stories.

A highlight this year have been the various **exhibition co-operations**. Besides the well-established co-operation with the *periscope* project space and two exhibitions with the Summer Academy co-teachers, five teachers and students participated in the *20 Propositions* exhibition in the Salzburg Kunstverein: exhibitions by Jakob Kolding, Emeka Okereke and Mark Van Yetter, and a performance with Ei Arakawa and Christian Naujoks and their class. Also, Ahlam Shibli contributed an extensive presentation to the exhibition (*in the still of the night*) in the Fotohof.

The Friday **Open Days** enabled visitors to get an idea of what had been produced in the various courses.

Facts and figures

This year saw 291 participants in 18 courses of between 1 and 4 weeks in Hohensalzburg Fortress and in the Kiefer quarry in Fürstenbrunn. The average age of the students was 37.5 years; they came from 49 different countries. The average number of participants in a course was 16, thus exceeding the goal of 15. 11 courses were fully booked. In all, 22 public events were held in the six weeks, as well as 4 co-operations with the Salzburg Kunstverein, periscope project space, Fotohof and Galerie Thaddaeus Ropac – attracting a total of around 2,800 visitors.
